

Sewer rehabilitation project in Royal Palm Dr and Michelle Ln area starting Tuesday, August 23

Kissimmee, Fla. (Monday, August 22, 2022) – Toho Water Authority (Toho) will be starting a rehabilitation project for a sewer lift station in the Royal Palm Dr and Michelle Ln area on Tuesday, August 23 (see attached map). The project is expected to be completed in 12 weeks. Schedules could vary according to weather and unforeseen circumstances.

Motorists and pedestrians are urged to use caution when approaching these areas, as workers will be present and speed limits may be reduced and sidewalks possibly closed and diverted.

As part of the project, a monitoring system is in operation for the lift station and nearby manhole. It is enclosed in a protective casing secured across the road. The travelling public should use caution as they will feel a bump driving over this protective casing which is about 2 inches above the road level.
